PBL and Wellbeing Focus

This week students are further exploring how their brain can grow and change when faced with challenges. They know that they can make their brain stronger and achieve tasks through practise, repetition and fixing their mistakes. Students are learning more about "growth mindsets" and what this means for their learning. Roughly speaking, two different mindsets can be said to exist: fixed and growth. Some people possess one, some people the other. And a third group possess a mixture; they might have a growth mindset in one area of life, but a fixed mindset in another. The central beliefs of each mindset are as follows:



Fixed Mindset

Intelligence is unchanging.

Leads to a desire to look smart and therefore a tendency to:

- Avoid challenges
- Give up easily due to obstacles
- See effort as fruitless

Growth Mindset

Intelligence can be developed.

Leads to a desire to learn and therefore a tendency to:

- Embrace challenges
- Persist despite obstacles
- See effort as a path to mastery
